



Detention Officer Certification

This 188 hour Detention Officer Certification Course will present the basic standard operating procedures for local confinement facilities and develop the role and responsibilities of professional detention officers. It is a great opportunity for those interested in criminal justice to quickly enter the workforce with a government job that includes a salary and benefits.

Our class certifies graduates, through Sheriff's Standards, to work in Detention Centers maintained by county agencies/Sheriff Departments throughout NC. Many Sheriff Departments use this assignment as a means of transitioning employees, which they select, to attend BLET and thereafter into Deputy positions outside the Detention Center.

At the conclusion of the course, an authorized representative of the Sheriffs' Commission will administer a comprehensive examination to each trainee who has participated in all of the course requirements. The student must score a minimum of 70% on the final Commission-administered written exam.

As of May 2017, the Bureau of Labor Statistics claims there are 428,870 jobs in the U.S. with a median salary of \$47,600.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizen
- At least 21 years of age
- High school graduate or equivalent
- Medical examination by a licensed physician
- Certified criminal history from each county that applicant has resided since the age of 16
- No felony or major misdemeanor charges

Telecommunicator Certification

The Telecommunicator Certification is a 50-hour course designed to provide entry level knowledge and skills to those interested in becoming an emergency services telecommunicator. Telecommunicators are qualified to work in 911 centers as well as other emergency dispatch centers and organizations.

At the conclusion of the course, an authorized representative of the Sheriffs' Commission will administer a comprehensive examination to each trainee who has participated in all of the course requirements. The student must score a minimum of 70% on the final Commission-administered written exam.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median salary of telecommunicators in the U.S. is \$39,640.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizen
- At least 18 years of age
- High school graduate or equivalent
- Medical examination by a licensed physician
- Certified criminal history from each county that applicant has resided since the age of 16
- No felony or major misdemeanor charges

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET)

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) is designed to give students essential skills required for entry-level employment as law enforcement officers with state, county or municipal governments or with private enterprise.

This program utilizes State-commission-mandated topics and methods of instruction. 36 blocks of instruction include but are not limited to, criminal law, juvenile law, civil process, traffic crash investigations, alcohol beverage laws, investigative, patrol, custody and court procedures, emergency responses, ethics and community relations.

Successful graduates receive a curriculum certificate after passing the certification examinations mandated by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and/or the North Carolina Sheriff's Education and Training Standard Commission. Additionally, our Law Enforcement In-Service Training offers both traditional and online classes to professionals locally and state-wide. We strive to not only offer the required continuing education classes, but to offer classes that will improve job performance, management skills, leadership, and knowledge. We are known as a One-Stop-Center where professionals can get needed recertifications and also learn valuable skills that allow for career advancement.

Opportunities for employment include: Police Officer, Deputy Sheriff, State Trooper, Correctional Officer, and Company or Private Security. The Bureau of Labor Statistics indicates that in 2016, there were over 807,000 jobs as police officers and detectives in the U.S. with a median salary of \$62,960.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- An online PCC admission application must be completed at www.cfnc.org
- BLET packets must be picked up from the Law Enforcement Training Facility at 2096 Central Park Drive in Winterville, NC
- High School Diploma or equivalent
- Letter of sponsorship by an N.C. Law Enforcement Agency
- Must be 20 years of age
- No felony convictions
- No major misdemeanors
- Must pass physical exam by N.C. doctor
- Must pass required reading test
